Bay Atlantic Dinner with Richard Strauss

Imagine what dinner conversation with Richard Strauss would be like at the December installment of free monthly music lectures by Paul M. Somers, sponsored by the Bay-Atlantic Symphony.

In the last of a four-month series of encounters with great composers whose fascinating lives and personalities create great dinner conversation, meet one of the most famous composers of the late 19th and early 20th centuries who, in his 70s and 80s, faced a major crisis in his uneasy relationship with the Third Reich.

The lectures, which take place in four counties, will occur on Tuesday, Dec. 1, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., at the Glassboro Public Library of the Gloucester Public Library System, 2 Center St., Glassboro; Wednesday, Dec. 2, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., at the Avalon Free Public Library, 235 32nd St., Avalon; Thursday, Dec. 17, from 6:30 to 8 p.m., at the Margate Public Library, Bloom Pavilion, 8100 Atlantic Ave., Margate; and Tuesday, Dec. 15, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., at the Millville Public Library, 210 Buck St., Millville.

The November Dvorak lecture at the Margate Public Library, has been rescheduled for Thursday, Dec. 10, from 6:30 to 8 p.m.

This lecture series is made possible by a grant from the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, a state partner of the National Endowment for the Humanities.
